

















Armstrong Senior's Activity Centre 2520 Patterson Avenue FRIENDSHIP LINKS -

A place and space to meet, mingle, learn and stay active for those who are 50 plus. The friendship links block represent relationships.



Armstrong Spallumcheen Chamber of Commerce & Visitor Centre, 3550 Bridge Street FLYING GEESE -

This building was originally the library and was built in 1959, a new addition was built in 1980. The Chamber of Commerce and Visitor Centre is an active, collaborative Chamber which supports the local Armstrong and Spallumcheen business network and provides visitor services to travellers.



Armstrong Spallumcheen Museum & Art Gallery 3415 Pleasant Valley Rd SWOON BLOCK - SUNFLOWER

A historic building which has undergone many transformations including a blacksmith, machine shop, storage facility, automobile garage, gas station and now a museum, art gallery and home to Armstrong archives.



Armstrong Pumpkin Patch 642 St. Annes Road AUTUMN HARVEST -

This farm has been in the same family for approximately sixty years.
Originally asparagus was grown here, bu after losing the asparagus to disease thirty years ago, the pumpkin patch began and is still growing.



Davison Orchards 3111 Davison Road, Vernon APPLE CIDER -

Sustainably farming in Vernon since 1933: farm to table fresh, local, in-season produce.



Fair Hill Farm 4365 Round Prairie Road, Armstrong

FARMER'S STAR -

In 1916 the property of 59 acres was bought by the Horn family. In 1945 lots were divided up. The Bosomworth's bought property in 1952. It is now owned by the Crich family, and this quilt is our largest yet!



Farmer John's Market 15 Grandview Bench Road, Grindrod

MAPLE LEAVES -

Authentic farmers' market with fabulous locally produced goods, including unique crafts, artisan cheese, baked goods, preserves, local fruits and veggies, pasture raised lamb and pork, and backyard chickens! SPCA certified. This building was newly built and opened in 2017.



Felmark Farm 5045 Schubert Road, Armstrong FARMER'S DAUGHTER -

The Felmark Farm came to life in the year 1982! This barn quilt is a favourite with the rich colours on the bright red barn!



Fieldstone Organics 4851 Schubert Road, Armstrong TRADITION BASKET -

George Paton was a Scot who came to Spallumcheen in the late 1880's. He acquired 320 acres and established a grain and cattle business. The small log house on this property was the original homestead. The large farm house was built in 1908 and has been extensively restored. The barn is used as an organic milling facility.



Frost Farm 4851 Schubert Road, Armstrong FLYFOOT BLOCK -

Wayne and Alberta Frost purchased this 10 acre farm in 1969. The farm was named Frostyvale Percherons and stock was purchased from Canada and the USA. From here a successful breeding program was begun and they showed their prize horses throughout western Canada. Many memories were made on this farm.



Hitt House & Barn 4537 Hullcar Road, Armstrong DOVE IN THE WINDOW -

Fredrick Charles Hitt came to Armstrong in 1913 and farmed at Hullcar. It was not until 1930 that he purchased 60 acres of land and built the house. He later cleared 42 of those acres himself.



Hullcar Hall 4194 Hullcar Road FRIENDSHIP CIRCLE -

This well-known simple frame building was built in 1909 by community members. This landmark is one of very few community buildings ever built in Spallumcheen. In 1968 community members met to rescue the old hall and by 1980 the Hullcar/Deep Creek Society was formed to renovate the building.



IPE Fairgrounds 3371 Pleasant Valley Road, Armstrong STORM AT SEA -

The Armstrong Interior Provincial Exhibition is one of the largest agricultural fairs in western Canada. Started in 1899, the farmers had an opportunity to show their livestock and produce, branching out each year to a bigger event. The red grandstand was built in 1960, one of the newer buildings on the IPE property.



Mooney House 1060 Corkscrew Road, Armstrong

SWOON BLOCK -

In 1904, an Armstrong resident by the name George Payne owned 160 acres of the property where the barn quilt is placed today. Throughout the years, the land has been broken up and sold to different families. The property is now owned by the Mooney family.



Odd Fellows Hall 3005 Wood Avenue, Armstrong SUSPENDER SAM & SUNBONNET SUE -

This building has many tales to tell within our little town. The hall was built by the Forresters and used as a church. It then became a library; a home economics and industrial arts building for the high school; the school board office and is now known as the Odd Fellows Hall.



O'Keefe Ranch 9380 Highway 97, Vernon

TRIPLE STAR .

Founded in 1867, O'Keefe Ranch was the end of the wagon road into the Okanagan Valley and the site of the stage coach depot. This heritage site now shares the local history by telling the story of early ranching in BC.



Red Caboose Smith Drive & Smith Road DOGWOOD -

The caboose is a classic attraction in Armstrong. It is a restored CN Caboose, built in 1943 and it once served as the Armstrong Visitor Centre.



Reimer Farm 4544 Salmon River Road, Armstrong BEAR PAW -

One of the "newer" barns in town, built in 2000 on a large acreage. This large barn is beautifully accented by the red and white barn quilt.



Rogers Foods 4420 Larkin X Road, Armstrong GRIST MILL -

This original "stone mill" opened in 1951 and was known as A.J. Rogers Wholesome Foods. The name was later changed to Rogers Foods. Quality flour and cereal products are milled here with Canadian grain from BC and AB farmers. (Nothing beats baking with fresh flour!)



Royal Canadian Legion Branch #35 2526 Pleasant Valley Blvd. Armstrong

POPPY WREATH -

The Legion is a non-profit Canadian service organization serving veterans, ex-service personnel, seniors, youth, and many aspects of community life. The Legion was founded in 1925 to support WWI veterans. This branch has been at this location since 1994.
